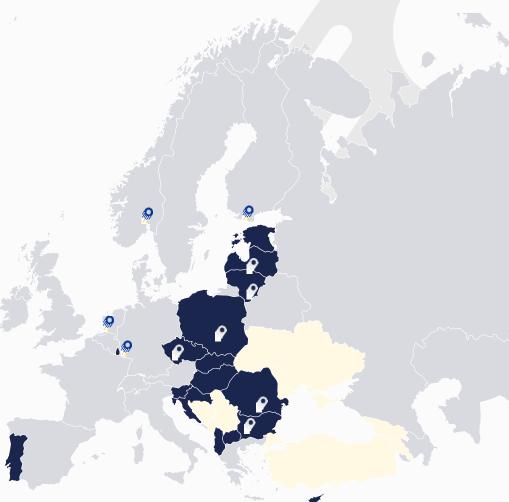

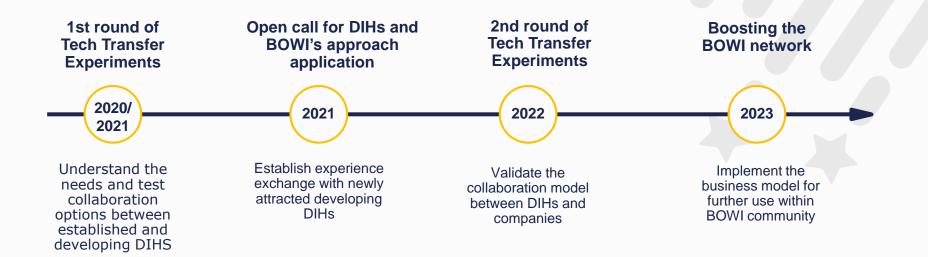
- Explore and validate various business models for further inter-hub and cross-regional collaboration during the technology transfer experiments
